Our mission is to enrich the lives of people in Okanogan County by making the arts an integral and dynamic part of public school education, economic vitality, and community.

Position Summary

This position will specialize in providing trauma-informed and equitable art education for youth at the Methow Valley Elementary School(MVE). The Methow Valley Art Specialist will work collaboratively with MVE teachers and administrators, Methow Arts staff and professional artists to design and implement visual arts classes that both instruct students in foundational art skills and foster belonging and wellbeing. This position will join a small team of professionals that are dedicated to empowerment of young people through art and the belief that all the youth of Okanogan County deserve access to inclusive and inspiring art instruction.

The Methow Valley Arts Specialist will excel at working with young people from all backgrounds and identities and will strive to support students by meeting them where they are at and supporting them in exploring their inner-worlds through creative expression. The Methow Valley Art Specialist will excel at classroom management and create safe and inspiring space for program participants. The Methow Valley Art Specialist will also need to excel at relationship building with school staff and coordination with teachers and artists to execute implementation plans.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Maintains up to 1 hour of weekly art instruction in grades K-6, aligned to classroom-based and grade level units of study using the standards of art and fundamental principles of design.
- Works with the Education Director, school staff, professional artists and Executive Director to create visual arts programming using already established curriculum and adding new and exciting options.

- Cultivates relationships with teachers, support staff, and administrators.
- Assists in collection of feedback, photos and testimonials from partners and youth.
- Participates in professional development and staff training to support trauma-informed instruction, integration of social and emotional education, and creation of programming that is equitable and inclusive.
- Coordinates performance art assembly offerings and Missoula Children's Theater.
